Pease take note of the following key school events:

1. TEMPERATURE-TAKING EXERCISE

The school will be conducting a temperature-taking exercise on **Thursday 4 July.** We would like to seek parents' / guardians' assistance to ensure that your child / ward has a working thermometer. Should your child /ward be unwell, please bring him / her to see a doctor, and refrain from coming back to school until he / she has recovered.

2. YOUTH DAY

Youth Day will be on **Sunday 7 July**. It is celebrated as an encouragement to youths to act on their aspirations and dreams to achieve their ideals and promising future. The following **Monday 8 July** will be a **scheduled school holiday**.

3. READY TO SEND PROGRAMME FOR YEAR 4 STUDENTS ATTENDING IEP IN TERM 3

In preparation for the Industry Experiential Programme (IEP), students from 4HS1, 4HS3, 4RS1, 4RS3, 4MS1 and 4FS1 will be going through the READY TO SEND Programme from **Monday 1 July to Friday 5 July**. Students will be <u>dismissed from school at 12pm</u> during this period except for Friday 5 July where the dismissal time will be at 1230pm.

4. NRIC REGISTRATION

All students born in **2004** will be eligible to register for their identity cards. The NRIC registration exercise will be held in NorthLight School on **Tuesday 16 July**.

All eligible students are required to bring the following documents and amount for payment:

Students who missed the photo-taking session earlier this year, will be required to take their own photo and bring it on registration day. Students who are unable to make payment on the day will not be registered. They will have to make an appointment with ICA and go down personally.

5. NORTHLIGHT SCHOOL'S GREAT OUTDOOR EXPERIENCE AND DELOITTE IMPACT DAY

The annual NorthLight School's Great Outdoor Experience will be held on **Friday 2 August** at the Singapore Sports Hub. All students are required to attend the school event which will be held from **7.30am to 12.30pm**. Parents are welcomed to join their child / ward. More details will be made available closer to the date. The event exposes our students to outdoor physical activities that not only requires physical and mental strength but also builds up confidence in dealing with their everyday life. It also promotes camaraderie among their peers and friends thus building a closer bond to the school.

6. NATIONAL DAY CELEBRATIONS

Singapore's 54th National Day will be celebrated on **Thursday 8 August** in NorthLight School. The theme "Our Singapore" complements the Bicentennial celebrations. The day will begin with a formal commemoration of Singapore's birthday and success as a nation. This will be followed by classroom activities. Attire for the day will be the P.E. attire and **school will end at 10.30am**.

Please note that **Friday 9 August** is a National Day public holiday and **Monday 12 August** is a Hari Raya Haji public holiday. School will resume on **Tuesday 13 August**.

7. ISC COURSE OPTION BRIEFING FOR PARENTS

The ISC course briefing for all Year 2 parents has been scheduled on **Wednesday 14 Aug 2019.** We encourage all Year 2 parents to attend the session so that you can help your child to choose a suitable ISC course. A detailed letter will be issued to your child/ward before the scheduled briefing date.

8. SCHOOL HEALTH CHECK AND IMMUNISATION

The School Health Service Team from the Health Promotion Board (HPB) will be in NorthLight School from 29 July to 14 August to conduct health check-ups / immunisation for our students. Parents / guardians will be informed if your child/ward requires follow-up referrals after the medical check-up. Non-Singaporean students are requested to bring their Health Booklet and Immunisation certificates (if any) along to the health check-up.

9. NATIONAL MYOPIA PREVENTION PROGRAMME

NorthLight School will be screening students in partnership with HPB to identify students from Year 1, 3 & 4 who may require spectacles based on their vision screening results from 4 July to 19 July. All Year 2 students will be screened as part of the annual school health check.

10. SCHOOL DENTAL SERVICE

The School Dental Service from the Health Promotion Board (HPB) will be in NorthLight School from 13 August to 31 October to conduct dental screenings for all Year 1 – Year 4 students.

11. 5 DAY ATTACHMENT WITH CHANGI AIRPORT GROUP

Selected Year 3 students will be going through a 5-day attachment programme with the Changi Airport Group from **19 August to 23 August** as part of their Career Development Programme. The programme will focus on grooming etiquettes, service excellence and work readiness.

12. WORKPLACE LITERACY AND NUMERACY (WPLN) ASSESSMENT
