2. YEAR 1 - PERSONALISED LEARNING DEVICE

Year 1 students who have applied for the purchase of their Personal Learning Device (PLD) will receive their devices on 22 March (Fri) during school hours. The PLDs will support student in the development of their 21st Century Competencies and digital literacies. Devices will be stored securely in the classroom charging cabinets and retrieved for learning use. Students will bring home their PLDs during HBL days and term breaks.

3. YEAR 1 TO YEAR 3 MID-YEAR ASSESSMENT

The mid-year assessment is an integral part of NorthLight School curriculum. It provides both teachers and students with feedback to address learning gaps and enhance teaching practices. The schedule and topics for the assessment will be given to students at a later date. Students will also be dismissed from school after their last paper for that day.
